Dear services and providers

The Premier announced additional restrictions for parts of New South Wales in press conferences over the weekend. The Department has outlined what this means per Local Government Area (LGA) to help services and providers understand the latest updates.

This advice is current as of 8 August 2021 and is subject to change of stay at home orders or an update of the Public Health Order following advice from NSW Health.

## Keeping our ECE community safe

- Any staff, children or parents who have been to a location with a confirmed COVID-19 case will need to follow the NSW Health advice.
- People who have been to an identified venue of concern who have been identified
  as a close contact, will need to follow the advice from NSW Health and get tested
  and self-isolate for 14 days. This information will have been communicated directly
  to those who are close contacts.
- If you have been to one of the venues on the <u>NSW Government website</u> and have not yet been contacted by NSW Health, please call 1800 943 553.
- Anyone who is a close contact must isolate for the full 14 days as directed by NSW
   Health and cannot return to any Early Childhood Service during this time.
- Anyone who has even the mildest of symptoms including fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting or extreme tiredness should immediately be tested and isolate until they get a negative test result. When they are free of symptoms, they can return to your service.
