

COVID-19 update

Dear services and providers,

The Department is committed to providing regular sector updates and information when updates are made to the Public Health Order.

For staff who work in LGAs of concern, an extension has been applied for mandatory vaccination. You now need to have the first dose of a COVID-19 vaccination by 6 September 2021.

Getting vaccinated is an important way educators can protect themselves and the children in our services and their communities from COVID-19.

Book your vaccination now

Per the Public Health (COVID-19 Additional Restrictions for Delta Outbreak) Order (No 2) 2021 [NSW]:

By 6 September 2021:

Early education and care workers (16 years of age or older), and disability support workers, **who live or work** in one of the LGA's listed as an area of concern, must not enter or remain in their place of work unless the worker:

- o has had at least 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, or
- has been issued with a medical contraindication certificate.

By 6 September 2021:

An authorised worker **who lives in an area of concern**, must not leave the area of concern for work, unless the worker:

- has had at least 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, or
- o has been issued with a medical contraindication certificate.

Areas of concern are those Local Government Areas (LGA's) or parts of an LGA that are identified in the PHO as an area of concern.

How do I book my appointment?

If you are in the <u>LGAs of concern</u>, NSW Health has established priority Pfizer vaccination appointments to support early childhood educators to meet the new requirements. Eligible staff can visit the <u>NSW Government website</u> to book.

Proof of occupation (ID card or a letter from an employer) will be required at the appointment to demonstrate eligibility.

Can a worker be exempt from this requirement?

Workers may be exempt from the vaccination requirement if they have a medical certificate from a medical practitioner in the <u>form approved by the NSW Chief Health Officer</u> that certifies that because of a specified medical contraindication, the person cannot have a COVID-19 vaccine.

What happens if an employee is not vaccinated by 6 September 2021 or refuses to get vaccinated?

If, by 6 September 2021, your employee falls under the requirements of the PHO but has not had at least 1 dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, or has not obtained a medical contraindication certificate, they will not be able to attend their workplace.
