Community Preschool Update

Minor Capital Fund Now Open and Upcoming Webinar

Applications for the Minor Capital Fund are now open until 25 April 2022.

The Minor Capital Works Fund supports smaller-scale extensions or renovations and the recalculation of unencumbered space where it will result in an increase in community preschool places.

The maximum grant amount is \$100,000 (ex GST).

Minor Capital Works grants can be used to:

- Extend or renovate existing centre-based community preschools where it will result in an increase in community preschool places.
- Engage a certified building practitioner to re-calculate unencumbered space where
 it will result in an increase in community preschool places (Services in areas of
 need and demand that are aware they already have sufficient unencumbered
 space to increase their capacity without capital works are encouraged to consider
 this option).

Community and Mobile Preschool Update

Disability Inclusion Program evaluation

We have engaged the <u>Australian Institute of Family Studies</u> (AIFS) and the <u>University of New South Wales</u> (UNSW) to undertake an independent evaluation of the <u>Disability Inclusion</u>

<u>Program</u> (DIP).

Findings from this evaluation will help shape future funding decisions and improve the effectiveness and efficiency of DIP, to ensure children with disability and additional needs can participate in a quality early childhood education program on the same basis as their peers.

As part of this process, AIFS is conducting an <u>online survey</u> of NSW community and mobile preschools around the inclusion of children with a disability and additional needs at preschools.

The survey aims to understand how preschools are including children with additional needs, how they are using elements of the DIP to do this, and perceptions of the program's effectiveness.

It is focused on two program elements: High Level Support Needs and Sector Capacity Building.

All community and mobile preschools in NSW are invited to participate in this survey, even those who haven't engaged with the DIP.

Participation in this research is voluntary and all responses will remain confidential.

The survey is best completed by someone who is familiar with day-to-day service operations and inclusion practices, such as a Director. If these roles are shared, you can do the survey together.

There is only one survey per service and will only take 20 minutes to complete.
